Enrollment Regulations for Bergen Bible School

See chapter 4 of the Adult Education Act

Adopted 27.09.2018

- 1. Applications to Bergen Bible School are considered and decided on by the Headmaster or their delegate.
- 1. Entry is subject to the following conditions: Age limit 16 years.

Should an applicant require psychiatric or special educational assistance, the school has to take into account whether it has the resources and expertise available or whether such can be obtained sufficient for the applicant's needs. (Cf. Adult Education Act §19)

1. The school accepts applicants from all countries.

Applicants from within the EU / EEA area are considered on a continual basis. The final application deadline is 30th of September for the current school year.

For applicants outside the EU / EEA, the application deadline is 15th of February.

Once the offer of a place at Bergen Bible School has been made and confirmed, students are expected to immediately begin to apply to all relevant public authorities in order to secure valid student visas / residence permits.

Applicants must be able to present an approved visa / residence permit no later than 15 th of May. If a visa has not been approved by that date, such applicants will be placed on a prioritised waiting list (see point 5). If there is still a place for them, they be able to begin at the Bible School as long as their visa arrives in reasonably good time for the start of the school year.

Tuition is interpreted to English only. It is assumed that an applicant has sufficient command of English to be able to follow the teaching and take part actively in the school environment. (NB: most of the Norwegian students will speak English.)

- 1. An administration fee of NOK 350, must be paid within 14 days, after the student has confirmed their place at Bergen Bible School. This amount is non-refundable.
- 1. When there are more applications than places, prioritisation is made according to the following criteria:
- a. Norwegian citizenship
- b. Date / time of application
- c. Membership of assemblies working with *Kristent Nettverk*
- d. Completed High School education

Prioritisation of English-speaking applicants outside the EU / EEA area:

Bergen Bible School has the capacity for up to 4 students of this category. Their applications are given priority according to the following criteria:

a. Membership of assemblies working with Kristent Nettverk.

b. Date / time of application

1. Decisions on admission are considered 'singular decisions', cf. Section 2 of the Public Administration Act, paragraph 2, point b.

Applicants have a right of appeal and have the right to review the case documents, cf. the Norwegian Public Administration Act, Chapter IV-VI. The Mayor of the County-Council is the arbitrator of any such appeal.
